

Incident Summary



- Time period: February 3, 2013 to April 15, 2013
- The National Iranian Tanker Company ("NITC") crude oil tanker "Daisy" clandestinely transported oil from the Egyptian-controlled Suez-Mediterranean ("SUMED") pipeline to Syria.
- The "Daisy" subsequently returned to the SUMED pipeline and signaled its intention to voyage to Malta, then changed course following UANI's direct communication with the Government of Malta.



Incident Synopsis




- March 15, 2013: "Daisy" makes a delivery of Iranian oil to Turkey. (Alerts 1-4)
- March 22-29, 2013: "Daisy" makes a second delivery of oil, sourced from the Egyptian-controlled SUMED pipeline, to Syria. (Alerts 5-6)
- April 3, 2013: "Daisy" makes a second stopover at the Egyptian pipeline, and signals an intended journey to Marsaxlokk, Malta in potential violation of EU sanctions. (Alert 7)
- April 5, 2013: UANI privately corresponds directly with the Government of Malta which, on April 8, 2013, reaffirms its commitment to international sanctions against the NITC. "Daisy" then changes its stated destination to Bandar Abbas and begins a return journey to Iran. (Alert 8)



Upload of Oil at Sidi Kerir



 March 22, 2013: "Daisy" makes a stopover at an anchorage near Sidi Kerir, Egypt and uploads oil.





Example: Supertanker loading oil at an offshore oil spigot


The "Daisy" and the SUMED Pipeline



 March 22, 2013: "Daisy's" upload of oil at Sidi Kerir occurs at an offshore oil spigot, identified by MINERVA as the Mediterranean terminus of the Egyptian-controlled SUMED pipeline.

Distribution of offshore oil spigots at Sidi Kerir


The "Daisy's" Delivery of Oil to Syria



 March 28, 2013: "Daisy" sets a course for Syria, disabling its AIS transponder en route to conceal its movements.

 March 29, 2013: "Daisy" completes its delivery of oil to Syria, offloading 991,720 barrels of oil at an anchorage near Baniyas,

Syria.



The "Daisy's" Attempted Voyage to Malta



- April 5, 2013: "Daisy" signals an intended voyage to Marsaxlokk, Malta. UANI successfully calls on the Government of Malta to deny entry to the "Daisy."
- "Daisy" then changes its stated destination to Bandar Abbas and begins a return journey to Iran, passing through the Suez Canal on April 15th.
