

**Incident Report: "Ramtin"**

# **Incident Summary**



- Time period: September 10, 2013, to October 28, 2013
- The Islamic Republic of Iran Shipping Lines (IRISL)-linked vessel "Ramtin" loads oil at the Iranian port of Bandar Abbas
- The "Ramtin" undergoes complex efforts to disguise its identity and route while en route to Singapore
- The "Ramtin" approaches the VLCC "Star Bright," a Singapore-based Floating Storage Unit (FSU), in a crowded area near the Singapore/Malaysia maritime boundary.
- The "Ramtin" engages in a probable Ship to Ship (STS) transfer, transferring Iranian crude to the "Star Bright"

## **Incident Overview**



- September 12, 2013: "Ramtin" leaves Bandar Abbas, Iran
- September 12- October 25, 2013: The "Ramtin" engages in an identity-spoofing scheme while en route to Singapore, using the identity of the UAE-based tanker "Hamoda K"
- October 25, 2013: The "Ramtin" appears in shipping lane immediately south of Singapore, then heads west to crowded STS anchorage zone
- October 27-28, 2013: The "Ramtin" approaches the VLCC "Star Bright," operated by Singapore based Southernpec Pte Ltd., and begins a probable STS transfer on October 27, 2013 at ~5:00 UTC
- October 28, 2013-ongoing: The "Star Bright" continues its operations as a FSU, allowing Iranian oil access to the global oil market



# The "Ramtin's" Loading of oil at Bandar Abbas



- Prior to September 10, 2013: "Ramtin" operates under the Mobile Maritime Service Identity # 422046300. MMSI numbers are identity signals that can be changed by the ship captain, and form the basis for a range of identity-concealing tactics used in smuggling operations
- September 10-12, 2013: "Ramtin" anchors near Bandar Abbas




"Splendour's" route: 5/25-6/23



## "Ramtin's" Route to Singapore



- September 12-October 25, 2013: The "Ramtin" begins transmitting its identity as MMSI 671291000, the MMSI number historically used by a UAE-based tanker.
- October 25, 2013: The "Ramtin" arrives in Singapore



# STS Transfer: "Ramtin"-"Star Bright"



- October 27, 2013: The "Ramtin" approaches the VLCC "Star Bright"
- October 27-28, 2013: The "Ramtin" begins a probable STS transfer with the "Star Bright"
- October 28, 2013: Following the transfer, Iranian oil becomes effectively blended into the global oil market
